LOS ANGELES LEAGUE OF CONSERVATION VOTERS ENDORSES JOSE HUIZAR FOR LOS ANGELES CITY COUNCIL

LOS ANGELES, Calif. – The Los Angeles League of Conservation Voters, the county-wide political action organization dedicated to supporting candidates and ballot measures that protect the environment, today announced their endorsement of incumbent Jose Huizar, for the Los Angeles City Council District 14.

“Serving as LA City Council Member this past year has been the greatest honor of my life,” Huizar stated. “I grew up in this district, right next to the 4th Street Bridge. I have fought to bring more parks and recreational facilities to our community, including the opening of Ascot Hills Nature Park, the Garvanza Skate Park, and opening the new Pecan Park Gym.”

LALCV President, Mitchell Schwartz is confident Jose Huizar will continue to show leadership on environmental issues. Mr. Huizar’s environmental approach includes involving the community in activities that teach kids about their world using the gardens and open space. As part of the Mayor’s Million Trees campaign, 500 trees out of a commitment of over 1,000 trees have been already planted in the Estrada Court Housing Project with the help of the community and the Councilmember.

Councilmember Huizar’s experience as a land use attorney lends depth to his understanding of urban planning and transportation issues, also key areas of environmentalism. He will make sure the legal processes are adhered to as his District grows.

In its 22-year history, the Los Angeles League of Conservation Voters has helped to elect more than 100 environmental leaders to local offices in Los Angeles County.
